























Mentorship News: Careers Awareness Week and Careers talks for Science Students

The Old Boys at SPC are very generous in coming back to the College and sharing their skills with the younger members of the College community – the students themselves. This year, with the 'double cohort' of two concurrent

graduating classes in Form 6 and Form 7 approaching, it was decided that the students needed assistance early in the year in making their careers choice. In this endeavour, we were assisted by a large number of SPC alumni in helping our 2012 graduating students with potential educational options and career choices.







Week brought together recent graduates and a number of more experienced alumni in sharing sessions in late September 2011. Some of the Old Boys who assisted included Alan

Wang (5F, 2009) (Cambridge) and Horace Yu (5F, 2009) (Imperial), who helped students in preparing for degree courses in the UK. They were assisted by Francis Lo (5F, 2009) and Leo Cheng (5F, 2009), who had just recently returned from the UK. During the same week, we were pleased to welcome Ho Wai (2007), who explained the field of psychology and how students could access academic courses and career possibilities. Also in health sciences, we welcomed back Steven Wong, who had spoken at a recent Careers Day, to share about the nursing profession, a major growth area in employment. In the Health Sciences also, Stephen Chan spoke to students about Nutrition Science and the career options and prospects. Recent graduate Anthony Yuen (2007), a weekend footballer at the College with other old boys, spoke about careers in Sociology, and how our students may access these. On the legal front, we were happy to welcome back Kenson Hung (2009) to talk about careers in law, and Hugo Chan (2007) to talk students through the requirements for PCLL for our aspiring solicitors and barristers. In the medical field, we welcomed back Mike Leung to speak to our students about Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. In a related field, Dr. Ross Lam (1998) spoke to us about biological sciences as a career path. Also we welcomed Paul Lee (1997) to talk about Chinese Politics to our graduating classes. The College would especially like to thank Mrs.

Solly Ngan for all of her work in organizing the sharing sessions for the Careers Awareness Week, and the library for hosting many of the activities. Most of all, we would like to thank the alumni themselves who gave up their valuable time to come back and share their insights.

To complement the Careers Awareness week, Miss Louisa Yu invited a number of students back to the College to promote 'Careers in Science' fair, featuring old boys who are now working in science related fields. The College welcomed back Alex Cheung (5F, 2003), a physiotherapist, and Wesley Yip (5F, 2003), an optomestrist, both with the Hospital Authority, to give some ideas about careers in these fields. Nicholas Hui (5F, 2003), a project officer with the Environmental Protection Department spoke about this growth area, while Raymond Hui (5F, 2009) talked about 1st year medical studies at HKU. Also, we welcomed back Kan Ho (5F, 2003), who works in medical engineering as a Senior Marketing Executive.

These are only a few of the Old Boys who come back to regularly update our students concerning careers paths. We are of course, fortunate at the College to also rely on our SPCAA mentorship group to extend their experience and offer their expertise to our students. When it comes to giving back to their alma mater, there are few, if any, schools that can rival the old boys of SPC.

Prodigy lands Oxford place two years early

When the new term begins at St John's College at the University of Oxford in October, the youngest student will be a 16-year-old son of a Hong Kong immigrant to Britain.

Hong Kong immigrant to Britain.
Canon Sun (pictured), who will
attend university two years ahead of
his peers, is a Year 11 boarding student in Brighton. He has received an
unconditional offer from the college
after racking up a long list of stellar
academic marks.

He achieved four A*s in the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) and two higher-level maths qualifications in 2010. Last year, Sun achieved 4.5.4%; (5.refers to a half course) and four As in the GCSE, an A* in A-level chemistry and another A in A-level physics.

His father, Sun Cheung-wai, a former maths teacher in Hong Kong, moved his family to Milton Keynes, England, in 2002.

Canon took his first A-level in maths, in Year 7, scoring an A grade. His father has been tutoring him. "I taught him as if I were his school



teacher," said Sun Snr, a father of three. Four years ago, Ca-

non joined his sister at a public boarding school in Brighton on the south coast of

England.
Sun Snr attributed his son's remarkable academic achievements to

the teenager's own efforts.
"It really depends on how hardworking a student is,' he said. "Everyone has about the same talents. In Britain, you can get pretty good results if you work hard."

The teenage prodigy plans to study physics, like his sister Regine, a student at Oxford. Canon is currently studying AS-Level arts subjects, including history and English.

Herty tuition fees aside, Sun Snr said he had never thought of enrolling his children in reputable private boarding schools, unlike many Hong Kong parents.

"The schools my children went to are little known," he said.

Raffles Invitational Mathematical Olympiad 2011, Singapore



我要對老師們說對不起,當年讀書用功不足,結業考試考三級六等,考了一個三級乙等,是最低的級別,再不存在退步空間,遭受讀書考試以來最大的打擊。14年後,我想告訴老師們,我的普通話水平已經從三級乙等提昇到二級乙等,勉強達標了。

學習,是沒有終點的,只有連綿不斷的起點。在另一個14年,甚至 是28年、42年之後,希望同學都不會忘記中二時候在北京的學習,當大 家想起北京的片段,請讓在座的每一位也成為你回憶風景的某個部分。

學習團,除了學習,還有另外重要的事。同學們共同相處、溝通,從中促進師生情誼及同學友誼。我們讀書,也在讀人,通過觀察、交流,學習正確的待人態度,培養求同存異、互相包容的胸襟,尊重不同的文化,而非唯我獨尊。同學們回到祖國,看到中國文化有其優秀的一面和保留的價值。老師們希望,同學能從中多了解中國文化,學好中國語文和中國歷史,做一個有為的知識青年,關注人類的幸福,貢獻社會,功在家國。

最後,我要感謝每一位同學,在學習期間守好紀律,留心聽講,敢 於發問,獲得清華老師們的高度評價,發揚了聖保羅精神,同時讓北京 文化考察團圓滿的成為大家學習中國文化的又一個起點。

SPC Exchange Students say, "Guten Tag" to Germany

Three students from Form 3, Alex Wong Ho Cheung, Nathan Lau Chun Shiu and Edmund Sung departed with Miss Josephine Ho late in March 2012 for the Exchange Programme to Berlin. They were scheduled to spend two weeks in a school called Phorms Berlin Mitte.



All three students chose to sit the non-English subjects like German and Spanish and the teachers attempted to explain the lessons in English for the benefit of the boys. They experienced a totally different culture and teaching environment. They were also impressed by strict discipline enforced in the school as well as the self-discipline of the citizens in Berlin.

All three students have expressed gratitude to the school for this invaluable and memorable experience. They have won overseas friends and are ready to play host for the students from Berlin in the coming academic year.

Below is one of the accounts written by Nathan.

This trip is a totally unforgettable experience for me. I had never been to Berlin before, so everything there was new to me. The program was only 17 days long, but I am sure I will remember every single moment I spent in Berlin for the rest of my life.

The family I was staying with is the Gruschovniks. My buddy is called Darius, who visited St. Paul's College as an exchange student for 3 weeks

last year. After three weeks of getting along together, we became good friends. Once we even got lost in the city together! Darius has a brother and a sister. His brother is only 2 years old and his sister is about 10 years old. They were both really nice to me and we spent a good time together.





"Phorms Berlin Mitte" is a bilingual school. It is neither an international school nor a traditional government school. So they have an equal amount of English lessons and German lessons. The school campus used to be an industrial factory and it looks really classical. They have teachers of different nationalities: British, German, American and even Filipino!

The teachers are funny and nice. Their teaching style is relaxed, so learning is really enjoyable there. Their mathematics level at secondary school is rather lower than Hong Kong, so I was like a Mathematics professor and I taught them how to solve problems in trigonometry!

I made a lot of friends in Phorms. It is easy to make friends with the students there because they are very straightforward and unpretentious. They are all very curious about the Chinese culture and they often ask questions like "Do Hong Kong people eat McDonald's food?" or "Do you need to shut down your Facebook account once you go back to China?" I hope we are still friends the next time I see them again!

to check the students' eye-sight and prescription glasses would be provided free to the needy children. It was impressive to find that the students were disciplined and would help with the daily chores like washing the floors and moving desks and chairs after school, all without



the help of the janitors or the supervision of the teachers. All were done in a flash and with a minimum of noise!

The feedback from the students showed that they found the act of giving really

Trinity Pawling Trip

For the third time, St. Paul's College has joint efforts with Trinity Pawling School of Pawling, New York to provide our senior form students with an educational exchange opportunity. From 18 applicants, six deserving

students were chosen to take part in this program. Among them were student leaders such as the president of the Students' Association and the chairman of the English Society. Accompanied by two teachers, Mr. Alex Wong and Mr. K. S. Kwok, the group embarked on a week-long journey on 21st April. For most of the participants, it was their first trip to the United States.

Bearing gifts and overwhelmed with excitement, we left Hong Kong to experience what life is like at a boarding boys' school in North America. We received the warmest of welcomes by the teachers, the student buddies and the Headmaster Mr. Archibald Smith and Mrs. Smith, at whose place, Gamage House, we had the honor to be accommodated.

Attending classes at TP was a major part of the program, not only for the six students, but also for the teacher chaperones. It was indeed an eye-opening experience for us all. The class size is generally smaller, the atmosphere is more relaxed and the students are more active in their learning. As TP is a boarding school, members of staff are involved in virtually every aspect of the students' growth and development. Besides teaching, many also serve

as sports coaches and dormitory parents. Even mealtimes are spent together in the same dining hall.

To reciprocate all that we were offered at Pawling, we rendered our service by helping out at a farm nearby called Farm at the Holmes, which turned out to be yet another great experience. None of us



could have ever known how hard it would be to plant snow pea seeds if we had not actually tried that. We also learned that the farm was constantly in need of extra hands and TP students were among those whose presence could often be seen there. There is a strong sense of community at TP and we were all very



grateful that for one week we were included in this community.

As Pawling is less than two hours by train from New York City, we made sure that we had a taste of the juicy Big Apple. A bus tour of the city from midtown to Harlem to South Street Seaport and back, lunch in Little Italy, a close look at Lady Liberty, a leisurely stroll in Central Park and a panoramic view from Top of the Rock were among the highlights of the visit. There was unfortunately not enough time for the Met to see the artistic side of the city. Still, we managed to catch a glimpse of its spiritual side at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine and its commercial side on Fifth Avenue.

The trip ended with new ideas about and insights into teaching, learning and life in our heads. More than anything, we will all cherish the wonderful experience we shared with each other and with our new friends at TP, an experience made possible by the support and vision of our school, St. Paul's College.



It is with sadness that I inform you of the passing away of **Mr. John Eynon**, who taught in St. Paul's in the 60's.

Mr. Eynon came to Hong Kong as a fresh graduate in 1960 from the UK and taught English and History in St. Paul's. His dedication to his teaching profession, care and concern for the welfare and well being of the students touched all, including the toughest and naughtiest among us.



He went to Singapore and taught in Dunman High School and established the same reputation as a dedicated teacher. When he was due to retire in the early 80's to return to the UK, he made newspaper headlines there by tearing up his plane ticket at the airport. He was so moved by the large group of students and colleagues who were there to say farewell to him, he decided to stay on and continue teaching in Singapore.



He eventually retired and continued to do voluntary work for the church. Unfortunately, his memory became progressively weaker and he spent the last years in a home for the aged.

I visited him from time to time but he had difficulty in recalling or remembering things. Old St. Paul's boys who visited Singapore also dropped by to visit him, and cheered him up greatly by

bringing ice cream, his favourite.

All of us who had been taught and influenced by him will remember him fondly. He is truly Teacher Extraordinaire.
